As Stoa passes the 15-year mark as a league, we find ourselves in an equally exciting and also challenging place. Simultaneously, we have experienced a tremendous growth of over 70% in the past three years. Stoa's Board of Directors celebrates the fact that so many more students and families have embraced our mission of training young people to speak boldly and change the world for Christ and are part of our robust and unique national homeschool community, but we also take seriously the need to preserve our culture and identity as an organization. 

SERVANT HEART

The Stoa Board gives recognition to both individuals and clubs growing in their character and speaking skills through the Servant Heart Award, desiring this will inspire all Stoa students and clubs to share their skills to change the world for Christ.

The 2024 Individual Servant Heart Award winner is Ben Janssen. Ben spent more than 200 hours teaching God's Word and befriending underprivileged refugee children as well as hosting a three day VBS-style camp. Ben exemplified a servant heart in his ongoing lifestyle of service and evangelism.

The 2024 Club Servant Heart Award winner is AIM of Spokane, Washington. AIM partnered with Heroes of the Nation to provide teaching and the first international Stoa tournament in Kenya, Africa.



The Stoa Board of Directors, in 2022, established the Mike Winther Award to honor the memory of one of Stoa's founders, Mike Winther. Mr. Winther was integral in the development of many of our original documents and processes. The award recognizes excellence in character as demonstrated in student leadership, civic involvement, and the understanding of the Biblical role of government.

The pinnacle of Stoa's year arrived with the National Invitational Tournament of Champions. For this forensics competition, Stoa returned to Union University in Jackson, Tennessee for a third time. We were warmly welcomed by the university and spent a week full of competition and bringing glory to God.

Our theme, Better Together, encompassed our times of devotion, worship, social events, and fellowship. Together we also impacted the local community by donating almost \$5000 in goods to the Dream Center, a local Christian organization that provides housing for women and their children who have experienced crisis and/or loss.

We were pleased to welcome 595 competitors and their families representing 26 states which almost reached the record of 630 in 2014! Several hundred local community judges volunteered their time to serve our community. We were also blessed by a large number of alumni and parent judges. The efforts of our volunteers contributed to the success of this week. Almost 300 parents served in tournament staff roles. We truly are Better Together.

I Stoa Family Academy

Stoa Academy 2024 was held online this year, allowing more participants than ever before. This annual event showcased the skills and knowledge as well as the culture that makes Stoa the outstanding Christian homeschool speech and debate league that it is.

There were 70 different sessions for students and parents/coaches that included topics ranging from speech and debate training to tournament preparation. In addition, our general sessions focused on topics such as Stoa's culture, leadership development, and competing with integrity. There were several roundtables in which participants were given the opportunity to ask questions and give feedback to national leadership on a variety of issues. Our online format allowed families to participate without having the expense of travel and, therefore, reached a broader base of families than an in-person format. We were blessed by our time spent together, and we look forward to Stoa Academy 2025!
